We learned that on Rosh Hashana we hear the shofar blown and discussed how its sound reminds us to try to do only good things. We practiced making the long, medium and short sounds of the shofar. Our class took a little trip to Tashlich (in the backyard) and practiced throwing away all the not so good things we've done. We also learned about the special foods that we eat during Rosh Hashana and the blessings that they symbolize.

As we are adjusting to all the new changes of a brand new school year, the Morahs have kept the students very busy. This year the children will have a structured alphabet curriculum in conjunction with the Judaic curriculum. Already your child has learned so much in so little time.

As for the English curriculum, the children will be learning a letter every week. They will live and breathe this letter for a week or two. During the first half of the month of September the children have learned the first three letters of the alphabet. We are very impressed on how the children are absorbing all the new material. Every week the children will be doing a variety of activities in regards to the letter. For the letter A, the children put apple stickers on the letter A. During the week of letter B, the children put all kinds of things such as, brown string, blue string, black string, buttons and beads into a bag and made a butterfly from all the materials.

As your child gets older we will observe to see if he or she gains any interest into older age appropriate activities. If so, we welcome them to be a part of them, like writing and cutting.
