Dear Parents,

Now that the Holidays are over, we began learning the first Parsha (portion) in the Torah!

Bereishit: We started by discussing what the world was like before Hashem (G-d) created it. It was empty! There were no trees, no birds, no people, no colors, there was just nothing! Hashem decided to make a world so that people can do mitzvos (good deeds). Hashem made the world in six days. We made a Parsha book that had the 6 days of creation.

Day 1: Dark and light. We covered our eyes to see what darkness looked like and then shined a flashlight to see how bright light is.

Day2: Clouds in the sky, and water on the ground.

Day 3: Land, trees, grass, flowers, fruits, and vegetables.

Day 4: Sun, moon, and stars.

Day 5: Birds and fish.

Day 6: Animals and people-that's us!

On Shabbat, Hashem rested. That's why we don't go to school on Shabbat-so we can rest, just like Hashem did. We had a great time using a magnifying glass to discover all the tiny things that Hashem created. We know that Hashem made all the small things and all the big things. He made all the things that are close to us and all the things that are far away.

Noach: A long time ago the people in the world were not behaving. They were mean to each other and made bad choices. Only one man named Noah was behaving the way he should.
